

Verse of the Day: Mal 3:2 But who may abide the day of his coming? and who shall stand when he appeareth? for he is like a refiner's fire, and like fullers' soap.

Living the Word Today: Recognize and receive the purifying and protective nature of God's refining, consuming fire. Let it clean up anything that is not like Him.

This verse serves as a poignant reminder to prioritize our relationship with God above all else, avoiding the distractions that may lead us away from the intimacy we once had with Him.

Matt 22:37 Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.

In Romans, Paul encourages believers to be fervent in spirit. Lukewarmness can manifest as spiritual slothfulness. Instead, we are called to be fervent, zealous, and enthusiastic in our service to the Lord.

Rom 12:11 Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord.

Prayer Focus: Father, stir within me a fervent spirit, a passion for Your presence, and a dedication to serve You wholeheartedly. Guard me from the influences that may cool my love for You.

Verse of the Day: Rom 12:11 TPT Be enthusiastic to serve the Lord, keeping your passion toward him boiling hot!

Matt 5:14-16 Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hid. Psa 103:8 The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and plenteous in mercy.

Unlike human forgiveness, God not only pardons iniquity but also passes over transgressions. His delight in mercy far surpasses His anger, emphasizing His desire to extend forgiveness and grace to those who turn to Him.

Prayer Focus: Father, thank You for Your enduring mercy and Your faithfulness that allows us to experience new mercies each day. In moments of weakness and failure, help me find relief in the boundless compassion You extend.

Josh 24:15 And if it seem evil unto you to serve the Lord, choose you this day whom ye will serve; whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the flood, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell: but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.

God's Laws Written in Our Hearts

Heb 8:10 For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, saith the Lord; I will put my laws into their mind, and write them in their hearts: and I will be to them a God, and they shall be to me a people.

Hebrews speaks of a new covenant where God's laws are not only external commandments but are written within the very fabric of our minds and hearts. This internalization signifies a personal and transformative relationship with God. Paul emphasizes that believers are living letters, a testimony of Christ's work in their hearts. The transformation brought about by God's Spirit writes His laws on the fleshy tablets of our hearts, creating an enduring impact.

2 Cor 3:3 Forasmuch as ye are manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ ministered by us, written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God; not in tables of stone, but in fleshy tables of the heart.

When God's laws are engraved within us, our steps are steadied, and we are guarded against stumbling. His law, instead of being external, becomes a natural part of who we are.

Psa 37:31 The law of his God is in his heart; none of his steps shall slide.

Isa 64:8 But now, O Lord, thou art our father; we are the clay, and thou our potter; and we all are the work of thy hand.

The imagery of being formed by God's hands is a beautiful testament to the craftsmanship and care with which our Creator has fashioned each one of us. Isaiah poetically portrays God as the Potter and us as the clay. This vivid metaphor conveys the intimate relationship between the Creator and His creation. Every individual is uniquely shaped by the skilled hands of the Master Potter.

Psa 139:13-14 For thou hast possessed my reins: thou hast covered me in my mother's womb. I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvelous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well.

We are fearfully and wonderfully made. The hands of God are intimately involved in forming us even before our birth, showcasing His deliberate craftsmanship. The hands of God have fashioned us with the intention that we would walk in the good works preordained for us in Christ.

Eph 2:10 For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.

Prayer Focus: Father, thank You for forming me with such intricate care and purpose. I yield to Your hands, allowing You to mold me into a vessel of honor for Your glory.

Verse of the Day: Job 10:8 Thine hands have made me and fashioned me together round about; yet thou dost destroy me.

True faith acknowledges the existence of God and believes in His nature as a rewarder of those who earnestly seek Him. This kind of faith captures God's attention.

Mat 9:29 Then touched he their eyes, saying, According to your faith be it unto you.

In this healing encounter, Jesus emphasizes the direct correlation between the individuals' faith and the manifestation of the miracle. Our faith acts as a conduit through which God's power flows into our lives. Faith is not merely a passive belief but is accompanied by corresponding actions. Faith that catches God's attention is alive and demonstrated through righteous deeds.

Jas 2:17 Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone.

Prayer Focus: Father, teach me to diligently seek You and to anchor my faith in Your promises. Let my faith be vibrant and active, producing works that glorify Your name.

Verse of the Day: Mark 11:24 Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them.

Acts 1:8 But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.

Being in right standing with God (**righteousness**) is a source of spiritual power. Living by faith in God's righteousness positions believers to access divine, sustaining power. **The Holy Spirit** is the divine source of power promised by Jesus. His indwelling empowers us to be effective witnesses and enables us to live victoriously in the face of life's challenges.

Submission to God's will and authority is a powerful source of spiritual strength. By surrendering to God, we gain the strength to resist the schemes of the enemy, and the devil is compelled to flee. **Jas 4:7** Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

Prayer Focus: Father, I acknowledge Your righteousness and my need to live by faith. Thank You for the Holy Spirit, the divine source of power dwelling within me. Help me submit to Your will, resist the enemy, and experience victory.

Verse of the Day: Eph 2:6 And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus:

Sources of Spiritual Power: Part 2 (Agreement, Fasting, and Confession)

Matthew 18:19 - Again I say unto you, That if two of you shall agree on earth as touching anything that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of my Father which is in heaven.

Agreement in prayer is a powerful source of spiritual power. Jesus assures us that when believers unite in faith and agreement, their petitions will be granted by our Heavenly Father. There is extraordinary power when the Body of Christ comes together in harmony.

The words we speak shape our reality. By aligning our confession with God's Word, we release power that transforms circumstances and brings life into every situation.

Prayer Focus: Father, grant me the grace to pray in agreement, to fast with a humble heart, and to confess Your truth with boldness.

Verse of the Day: 1 John 3:24 And he that keepeth his commandments dwelleth in him, and he in him. And hereby we know that he abideth in us, by the Spirit which he hath given us.

Living the Word Today: Join in agreement with fellow believers, engage in purposeful fasting, and speak words of life and faith. Allow these sources of spiritual power to become fundamental traits of your walk with Christ, leading you to a deeper and more victorious Christian life.

How to Gain Boldness in Christ

Prov 28:1 The wicked flee when no man pursueth: but the righteous are bold as a lion.

The righteous, rooted in God's truth, stand firm and fearless. Prayer, coupled with the filling of the Holy Spirit, is a powerful catalyst for boldness. Acts 4:31 And when they had prayed, the place was shaken where they were assembled together; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they spake the word of God with boldness.

Paul's prayer for boldness in proclaiming the Gospel underscores the importance of relying on God for the courage to share our faith. Boldness is a gift from God that equips us to fearlessly declare the truths of the Gospel.

Eph 6:19 And for me, that utterance may be given unto me, that I may open my mouth boldly, to make known the mystery of the gospel.

Isa 58:12 And they that shall be of thee shall build the old waste places: thou shalt raise up the foundations of many generations; and thou shalt be called, The repairer of the breach, The restorer of paths to dwell in.

In the prophetic words of Isaiah 58:12, we find a powerful promise that echoes the divine intention to restore and rebuild. Isaiah paints a vivid picture of restoration and rebuilding, emphasizing our role as repairers of the breach and restorers of paths. The promise extends beyond personal blessings to becoming instruments of healing and renewal for generations to come. To be repairers and restorers, we must start with personal renewal. David's plea for a clean heart and a right spirit reflects the foundational aspect of restoration – a heart aligned with God's will.

Psa 51:10 Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me.

God's thoughts toward us are thoughts of peace and restoration. Embracing His plans for our lives aligns us with the promise of an expected end – a future filled with hope and purpose. His promise of restoration extends to the years lost to trials and challenges. His redemptive power can bring renewal and make up for what may have seemed irreparably damaged.

Jer 29:11 For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the Lord, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end.

Prayer Focus: Father, let Your thoughts of peace guide my life, and in Your mercy, restore the years that have been lost.

Verse of the Day: Joel 2:25 And I will restore to you the years that the locust hath eaten, the cankerworm, and the caterpillar, and the palmerworm, my great army which I sent among you.

Living the Word Today: Seek God for personal renewal and align your heart with His. He will restore!

March 19 23

Shedding Unnecessary Baggage

Isa 58:6-7 Is not this the fast that I have chosen? to loose the bands of wickedness, to undo the heavy burdens, and to let the oppressed go free, and that ye break every yoke? Is it not to deal thy bread to the hungry, and that thou bring the poor that are cast out to thy house? When thou seest the naked, that thou cover him; and that thou hide not thyself from thine own flesh?

Living the Word Today: As we shed unnecessary baggage, may we find renewed strength to run the race set before us, pressing toward the high calling of God in Christ Jesus. Cast your cares upon Jesus.

Psa 1:3 And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither, and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.

Being planted as a Christian means establishing a deep and unshakable connection with Jesus Christ. This involves accepting Him as Lord and Savior and building one's life on the solid foundation of faith in Him. Christians who are planted find their roots in the Word of God. Josh 1:9 Have not I commanded thee? Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the Lord thy God is with thee whithersoever thou goest.

The Lord's command to Joshua resonates with us today. His presence is our source of strength and courage. As we go about our daily lives, we can be confident that God is with us every step of the way. His presence is not limited by space or circumstance. Whether in heaven or in the depths, God is with us, guiding and holding us in His steadfast love.

Psa 139:7-10 Whither shall I go from thy spirit? or whither shall I flee from thy presence? If I ascend up into heaven, thou art there: if I make my bed in hell, behold, thou art there. If I take the wings of the morning, and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea; Even there shall thy hand lead me, and thy right hand shall hold me.

Matt 28:20 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.

In times of contentment or lack, God's assurance remains: He will never leave nor forsake us.

Sow in the Times of Famine

Prov 18:24 A man that hath friends must shew himself friendly: and there is a friend that sticketh closer than a brother.

Life often presents us with seasons of famine – be it in relationships, finances, joy, or peace. Proverbs encourages us to cultivate friendship and to be a friend ourselves. In times of relational famine, reaching out, and being friendly can lead to connections that are steadfast and supportive.

Phil 4:19 But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus.

God is our ultimate provider. In the midst of financial famine, trust in His promise that He will supply all our needs according to His riches. In seasons of joy famine, Psalm 30:5 offers hope. It assures us that joy will come, and God's favor is the source of life. The night may be long, but joy is promised with the dawn.

Psa 30:5 For his anger endureth but a moment; in his favour is life: weeping may endure for a night, but joy cometh in the morning. In times of famine in peace, Jesus' words in John 14:27 bring comfort. His peace is not of this world, and it has the power to calm troubled hearts and dispel fear.

John 14:27 Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

Prayer Focus: Father, in times of famine, I turn to You as my source of provision, joy, and peace. Give me strength and wisdom to navigate these challenges, knowing that You are faithful and will sustain me.

Verse of the Day: Gal 6:7 Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.

Living the Word Today: Continue to sow in times of famine. God will cause increase to come your way.

How to Crucify Our Flesh

Gal 5:24-25 And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts. If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit.

Crucifying our flesh begins with understanding that, just because something is legal to do, it doesn't mean it is right for us to do. We must walk in the spirit not the legalities of the law. Flesh is our human nature. We need to tell our flesh what to do instead of following its promptings, and it is a continual process of surrendering our desires and aligning them with Christ's will. Walk in obedience to God. In Romans, Paul urges believers to put to death the deeds of the body through the Holy Spirit. This act of mortifying the flesh is a conscious effort to live in accordance with the Spirit, leading to abundant life.

Rom 8:13 For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die: but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live.

Col 3:5 Mortify therefore your members which are upon the earth; fornication, uncleanness, inordinate affection, evil concupiscence, and covetousness, which is idolatry.

Prayer Focus: Father, I ask for discernment to identify areas of my life that need surrendering. Empower me through Your Spirit to mortify the deeds of the body.

Verse of the Day: 1 Cor 9:27 But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway.

Living the Word Today: Actively participate in the ongoing work of crucifying your flesh, allowing the Holy Spirit to guide you toward a life that reflects the likeness of Christ.

Fearing God

Prov 1:7 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge: but fools despise wisdom and instruction.

As we have a reverential fear of God, we tap into His knowledge and what He has for us. He can give us things that are beyond our understanding. Take the time to acknowledge God in all your ways and He will direct your paths.

Prov 3:6 In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths.

A deep reverence for the Almighty should permeate every facet of our lives. It shapes our understanding of His holiness and makes us wise. Our duty as humans is to fear God and keep His commandments.

Prov 9:10 The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom: and the knowledge of the holy is understanding.

Ecc 12:13 Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man.

Prayer Focus: Father, give me the wisdom to seek Your guidance, to keep Your commandments, and to experience the confidence and refuge found in fearing You.

Verse of the Day: Prov 14:26 In the fear of the Lord is strong confidence: and his children shall have a place of refuge.

Living the Word Today: Stand in awe of God. Be obedient to Him and respect Him. Honor His creation and thank Him for the people He places in your life.

See it Before You See It

Heb 11:1 Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

As Christians, our faith calls us to envision God's promises before they come to fruition. Faith provides a substantial foundation for our hopes and serves as evidence for things we cannot yet see. Seeing with the eyes of faith precedes the manifestation of God's promises.

Mark 11:24 Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them.

Seeing the fulfillment of our desires begins with a firm belief and confidence that God is faithful to answer our prayers. In Romans, we see Abraham's faith in a God who calls things into existence before they physically manifest. This principle encourages us to speak and envision God's promises into existence.

Rom 4:17 (As it is written, I have made thee a father of many nations) before him whom he believed, even God, who quickeneth the dead, and calleth those things which be not as though they were.

Prayer Focus: Father, help me to see with the eyes of faith, to pray with confidence, and to speak into existence those things that align with Your will. Strengthen my vision that I may walk in the assurance of things hoped for.

Verse of the Day: 2 Cor 4:18 While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal.

Living the Word Today: Through faith, prayer, and a focus on the unseen, witness the manifestation of God's promises in your life, bringing glory to His name.

March 31 35

Overcome All Fear

2 Tim 1:7 For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.

Fear can be a formidable adversary, but as Christians, we are called to overcome all fear through the power of God's Word. Fear does not come from God. Instead, He has equipped us with the spirit of power, love, and a sound mind.

Isa 41:10 Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness.

Isaiah provides a powerful assurance of God's presence and support, urging us not to fear. His promise to strengthen, help, and uphold us instills confidence in the face of fear. His presence dispels all fear, and we can confidently face any challenge. When we anchor ourselves in God's love, fear loses its grip, and we experience His perfect peace.

Psa 27:1 The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? the Lord is the strength of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?

Prayer Focus: Father, Your Word assures me that fear does not come from You, and in Your presence, there is perfect love that casts out all fear. Give me the courage to face challenges with confidence, knowing that You are with me, strengthening and upholding me.

Verse of the Day: 1 John 4:18 There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love.

Living the Word Today: Confront fear with faith, trusting in God's power, love, and perfect peace.
